Sandra "Sandy" L. LaBrie, 72 years of age from Minden, NE died on Tuesday, July 12, 2016 at CHI Good Samaritan Health in Kearney. Funeral services will be on Saturday, July 16, 2016 at 10:30 a.m. at the St. John's Catholic Church in Minden with Father James Benton officiating.
